In the devastation following Hurricane Katrina, people around the nation donated money and time to help the Gulf Coast region. Gary and Toni Simmons of Lexington were two of the 258 people who volunteered for United Way of the Bluegrass relief efforts.

United Way transformed the local Gifts In Kind warehouse into a regional drop-off center for personal care items. Gary and Toni arrived the first day ready to do anything and everything they could to help our neighbors to the south.

Gary operated the forklift and prepared donations for shipping while Toni shared her enthusiasm as she trained other volunteers. Together, the couple volunteered over 80 hours to make sure that 5,000 kits containing essential items such as towels, shampoo, soap and razors reached the hurricane victims.

Whether a natural disaster or loss of a job, United Way supports families in times of crisis. This is one example of the disaster, emergency and basic needs services United Way of the Bluegrass provides every day. United Way funded programs keep seniors and adults independent, provide counseling to rape victims and enable individuals to function better in their daily lives.

The Honor Guard of Man O' War Post 8 saw a need in the community to provide burial honors for area veterans. Seventeen volunteers of the Honor Guard now average two funerals a month to ensure that those who have served our country are given a proper farewell.

The Honor Guard was recognized as the Group Service Award winner at the 2006 Central Kentucky Volunteer Awards ceremony, one of many services of United Way's **Volunteer Bluegrass**. This initiative matches volunteers with available opportunities every day. Organized projects like Extreme Community Makeover and Care Days engage corporate and community volunteers. Last year, 2,248 volunteers were matched with 120 nonprofit agencies in Central Kentucky through United Way's **Volunteer Bluegrass**.

**Get On Board** is a 10-week program designed to recruit, train, place and retain board members for nonprofits in the community. The program gives voice to those who feel underrepresented and helps boards structure their leadership to reflect the populations they serve. To date, **Get On Board** has helped place over 100 trained leaders on community nonprofit boards.

Theresa is now making a difference and has quickly risen to the role of volunteer board president of Mother to Mother, a local nonprofit providing opportunities for mothers to connect and learn from other mothers across economic and racial barriers.

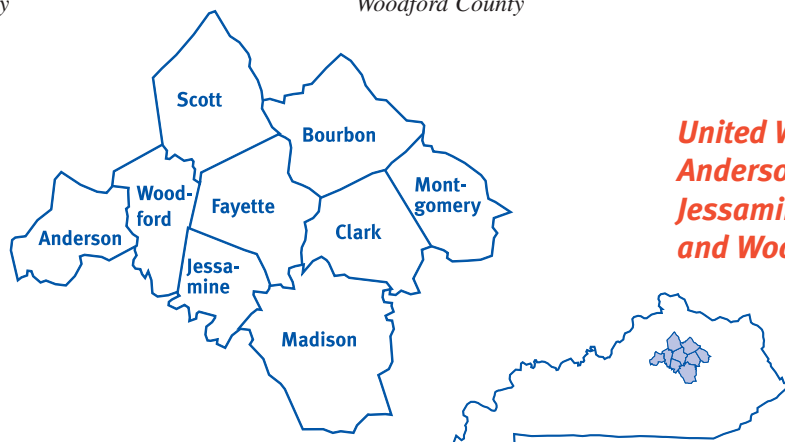

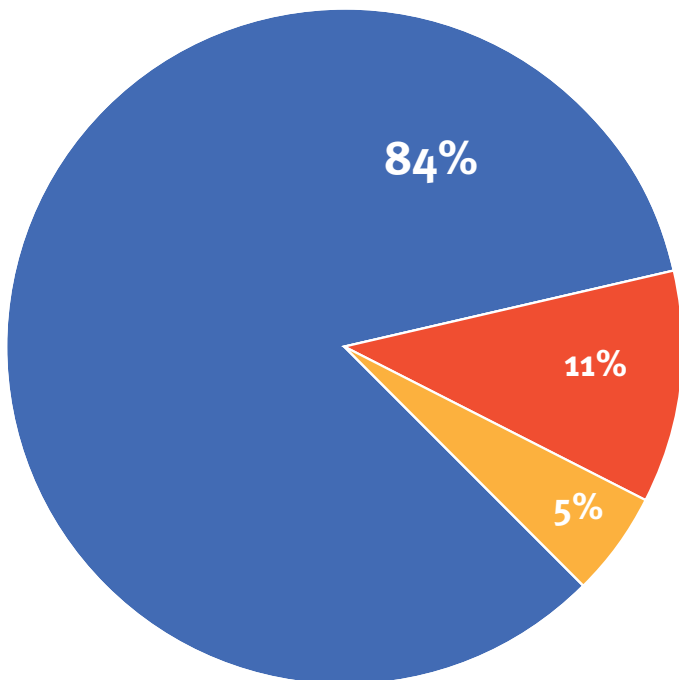
